We thought that is no such mention was made, some people might write to us about the Mainland sesshin, and it would save time all around if they wrote directly to whoever would be making the arrangements. I hope to make up the dummy of the D-S next week and start typing the stencils, so I'd appreciate hearing from you as soon as possible.
