



Bodhidharma	6th C. Introduced what became Zen from India to China. Comments on the precepts are only attributed to him.
Dōgen Kigen Zenji	Founder of the Japanese Soto Zen Sect. 13th C.
kōan	theme of meditation
Mu	a kōan, often the first one
Rinzai	a major sect of Zen Buddhism
rōshi	"venerable teacher"; Zen master
Sangha	Fellowship; one of the Three Treasures of Buddhism
sesshin	"to touch the mind" The Zen retreat.
sūtra	Buddhist scripture
teishō	the rōshi's public talk or lecture
zazen	directed meditation
dokusan	personal interview
also:	
Harada Dai'un Rōshi	20th C. founder of the so-called Harada-Yasutani line of Zen Buddhism, a kind of neo-Soto, or by another definition, an effort to restore original Soto. Uses kōan study, which the Soto Sect today does not.
