We hope this letter finds you in good health and spirits. As for Dai Bosatsu Zendo, we are all well and are doing the nineteenth Kessei. On July 4th, 1986, with the completion of the twentieth Kessei, our Dai Bosatsu Zendo will have been with us for a full decade.

We are now thinking how to sustain the practice that has taken one decade to establish. After much consideration about what has happened and what is likely to happen in the future, we decided to print the enclosed brochure in order to share with you what we have in mind.


There are three points:

- 1) To establish Dai Bosatsu Sustaining and Supporting Memberships.
- 2) To celebrate the Tenth Anniversary of Dai Bosatsu Zendo and to publish the Soen Roku.
- 3) To renovate the present Guest House and to incorporate the Mountain Inn and Culture Center.


